BIG LOTTERY FUND - PEOPLE'S MILLION

The People's Millions, a partnership between the Big Lottery Fund (BIG) and ITV, aims to improve communities across the UK and gives the public the opportunity to vote on which local projects should receive lottery good-cause funding.

There is now less than one month left for communities in the region to put in their bids to win up to £50,000 Lottery funding in The People's Millions 2010.

Funding is awarded to communities to improve facilities or help people get more enjoyment from their local area. Five bumper Big Lottery Fund grants are on offer in ITV regions with a total of £250,000 to be

awarded to community projects in the region.

Shortlisted projects will be showcased on local ITV evening news where they will have to convince the public why they most deserve the cash. The winner will be decided based on public votes.

BIG LOTTERY FUND - REACHING COMMUNITIES

The BIG Reaching Communities Fund remains open and will continue to be a key element of the BIG lottery fund's increased commitment to deliver the vast majority of their funding to the voluntary and community sector. The programme will continue to make awards between £10,000 and £500,000 and to fund for up to five years.

Improvements have been made to the application process:

HERITAGE LOTTERY FUND - YOUNG ROOTS

Young Roots is a grant programme designed to engage young people aged 13-25 years with their heritage.

Young Roots projects stem directly from the interest and ideas of these young people, who are supported by youth and heritage organisations to develop skills, build confidence, and connect with their local communities.

The programme budget is £3,000 to £25,000.

To receive a Young Roots grant, a project must relate to the varied heritage of the UK and:

- provide new opportunities for a wider range of young people aged 13 to 25 years to learn about their own and others' heritage;
- allow young people to lead and take part in creative and engaging activities;
- develop partnerships between youth organisations and heritage organisations;
- create opportunities to celebrate young people's achievements in

the project and share their learning with the wider community.

Your project must also create new opportunities for young people to either:

- volunteer in heritage;
- gain skills in identifying, recording, interpreting or caring for heritage.

Young Roots is a rolling programme and there are no deadlines for applications.

A decision will be given on your application within 10 weeks.

The People's Postcode Trust provides funding opportunities to small organisations, community groups and charities, through grants ranging from £500 - £10,000. Get Connected Investment Project

The Get Connected Investment Project is a capital grant scheme for the registered providers of adult social care in England. It will enable providers to improve access for their users, carers, visitors and staff to information and communications technology (ICT), so they can use the power of the Internet to communicate, learn and train. Grants of up to £20,000 will be available.

All bids must cover one or both of these objectives:
